

OpenAccess Face to Face

Details:

OpenAccess Face to Face is an iPad app that supports learning and conversation between Auslan and English.

The person speaking English chooses the words or phrase they want to say and then a short video shows an Auslan interpreter signing their selection. You can use one iPad or link two iPads. When iPads are linked, the video plays simultaneously on the other person's iPad. This allows the two parties to communicate.

The app is currently in use at the TradeBlock Cafe in Melbourne, where it helps with communication between Deaf students/employees who use Auslan, and hearing customers who use English.

There are more than 1800 signs on the app. Users can create sentences (something other apps don't offer) from a bank of phrases, and build favourites lists for frequently used words/signs.

With its large list of signs (one of Australia's biggest databases of Auslan) OpenAccess Face to Face is a popular tool for learning Auslan. To learn how to use OpenAccess Face to Face as an Auslan learning tool, [click here](#) [1].
