



Guidelines for contributing to Techfinder.org.au

Techfinder.org.au is a community site where people go to share experiences and advice with their peers.

When posting, it's important to remain respectful of each other's opinions.

Here are the guidelines for contributing to Techfinder such as posting reviews and blogs.

Note: A moderator checks all reviews and blogs when they are submitted. If your review or blog is nasty, rude, uses bad language, is offensive, explicit or inflammatory, the moderator has the right to edit or delete your post.

- Hateful or discriminatory language and comments are not acceptable and will not be published. Please be respectful of other people's race, religion, gender, age, disabilities, sexual identification and political beliefs.
- Please be aware people of all ages access this site, so keep that in mind when posting. Do not use bad language and refrain from posting mature content.
- Be constructive. Treat others the way you want to be treated. If you don't have something helpful to add, please don't post anything.
- Debates and discussions are healthy; however please think carefully about what you want to say before you submit a post.
- Make sure you read over your review/blog a few times before submitting, to make sure you've said what you meant to say.
- Use your real name when posting. This is a community site and the advice of a real person is much more valuable than that of a made-up screen name. First name only is fine. Made-up names may be edited or removed by the moderator.
- Write clearly and use proper punctuation in your posts. People come to Techfinder.org.au for advice and to read about your experiences, so make sure they can easily understand what you've written. If submitting an Auslan video, please articulate your signing clearly, so your viewers can understand what you want to say.
- Spam is not acceptable will be deleted.
